

Friendship, NY seems to be a little spooky. The town had its own Spiritualist society and was home to the Octagon House where seances were held [alleganyhistory.org]. The town was also the home of Signey Rigdon, a former member and founder of Mormonism, who spent his final days in Friendship and is buried in Maple Grove Cemetery

[alleganyhistory.org].

Sprinkled throughout this article are quotes made during the investigation through what paranormal investigators call a "spirit box". These devices are similar to radios and scan frequencies, listening for words.

There are "orbs" visible in many of the pictures. Orbs are considered by paranormal investigators to be the presence of spirits. Others believe they are ordinary dust particles on the camera lens.

Former director Peggy Braun took part in the investigation. In total there were 8 people involved, led by Scott McNeil.



In addition to spirit boxes, cameras, and audio equipment, there were trail cams, wrist recorders, laser grids, and EMF (electromagnetic field) meters.
